
'Super Star' KS1 Nativity Production - 8 December (2pm)


Pre-School Christmas Arts Afternoon - 13 December, 1.30-2.30pm



On Friday we will be participating in the Remembrance Service at Hackthorn war memorial. Our oldest and youngest pupils will lay the wreath on behalf of the Parish Council and we will perform our rendition of 'Pack up your troubles' and 'It's a long way to Tipperary' (acapella style). Please note that there will be NO Good Works assembly on this day, but you are all welcome to join us at the short service at 10:45am.
